



U.S. Export Restrictions:

Seagate® products and technology are controlled by the U.S. and other countries for export, re-export and end use. Seagate products may not be exported or re-exported without prior U.S. government authorization or exception to restricted parties, embargoed or sanctioned countries, or military end-users or end-users involved in developing, producing or distributing chemical, biological, or nuclear weapons of mass destruction, missile technologies, or other terrorist activities.
